Dear Parent or Guardian:

It is New York State law that **all** medications to be taken by a student while in school **must** be accompanied by a prescription from his/her healthcare provider **and** a note from a parent or guardian giving permission for it to be administered. All medication is to be brought in a container properly labeled with student's name, name of medication, dose and strength, what it is being given for, the time medication is to be given and student's grade. This applies to all medications including those sold "over the counter" such as acetaminophen (Tylenol) or Ibuprofen (Motrin).

If your child has an allergy (i.e.: bee stings), and will need medication in case of reaction, we **must** have the medication on hand and a **current** health care provider's order.

In the event that your child must carry an inhaler or epipen on their person, please fill out the accompanying form for our records as soon as possible.
