The Middleburgh technology committee meets regularly to discuss technology and all of its many influences on the organization; from software, professional development, innovation, equipment and beyond. The team includes members of the administration, faculty, IT staff, library media specialist, and teaching assistants. This team works closely with the Professional Development Committee and Admin Council to ensure that the work is aligned and mutually supporting of out tech vision and our district goals. This team has reviewed this plan and provided input.

Working within the existing and functioning structure of Middleburgh's Professional Development Committee we will partner with our educational technologist consultant (from Aspire) to plan and deliver training in Microsoft 365, use of video conferencing, scientific research, writing, publishing, collaborating, personalized learning, credit recovery etc. As well as preparing students for online assessments. The district has created an Early Release Day structure wherein each month faculty and staff can obtain two hours of high quality, teacher- driven and relevant PD to improve professional practice. This is an enormous asset to our Technology Plan as we gear up for our long anticipated funding from Smart Schools to upgrade our wiring and infrastructure and devices.

The plan seeks to transform our pedagogy from a one-size fits all, teacher centered model to a student centered, whole child and individual approach that privileges and foster collaboration and critical thinking.

Technology needs for identified students are assessed on an individual basis. Needs are identified on each IEP which aligned with the students annual goals. The district has invested in IPADS for SWD's across the both schools. For accessibility purposes some students have been assigned to individual IPADS to use throughout the day as well as home. Some students are given access to IPADS for specific assignments. Text to speech and speech to text functions are quite valuable. Low cognitive functioning students benefit from this technology as well.
