Voters to consider \$25.1 million budget proposal and capital project

On Tuesday, May 20, Middleburgh Central School District residents will be asked to consider a \$25,100,000 budget for the 2025-26 school year. This proposed budget increases spending by 0.80%, or \$200,000, from the current year and includes a tax levy increase of 1.50% or \$156,144. Since the tax levy increase (the total amount of money to be raised through property taxes) is less than the district's maximum allowable levy limit of 2.29%, the proposed budget needs a simple majority vote to be approved.

State Aid

New York State Foundation Aid is the primary source of funding for the district's general fund budget. As part of the state budget, there is an expected decrease of \$107,212 in aid for the 2025-26 school year.

Fund Balance Use

Middleburgh is proposing to use \$921,815 of fund balance to balance the budget. The fund balance utilizes end-of-year surplus from the general fund.



Capital Project

In addition to voting on the general budget, district residents will also vote on an \$8.1 million dollar capital project that would utilize state grants and \$2 million dollars from our Capital Reserve Fund to pay for over a dozen repairs and improvements to our facilities. If passed, the capital project would have no additional impact on our tax levy. See newsletter insert for additional information.

A Message from the Superintendent



Dear MCS Community,

Middleburgh is a great place to live, work, and learn. We are proud to share that in the 2024-2025 school year, MCS has once again earned the highest rating in the NY State Education Department's Accountability System—"In Good Standing."

Our academic foundation has been strengthened with field-based learning. Over 50% of our juniors and seniors are enrolled in Career and Technical Education programs through BOCES. This year, we provided Pre-K-12 students with over 100 field trip experiences, helping them explore "The World Beyond Middleburgh." A highlight was a trip to Washington, D.C., where students witnessed the presidential inauguration, deepening their understanding of civics and national history.

Our students and teams have earned scholar-athlete recognition by the New York State Public High School Athletic Association. Three athletes earned recognition at the state level in wrestling and bowling.

We are grateful for the community's support, which makes these opportunities possible. This year, we also expanded our regional collaboration with neighboring districts and strengthened partnerships with community groups to provide cost-effective ways to enhance learning opportunities.

The 2025-26 proposed MCS budget reflects a 0.80% increase in expenditures with a modest 1.50% proposed tax levy increase. This year, we will also ask voters to consider our Capital Project 2026, detailed in the newsletter insert. In addition, we are seeking approval to transfer funds to our Repair Reserve Fund, as part of our responsible fiscal strategy to minimize future impacts to the tax levy.

Thanks to the unwavering support of our community, MCS continues to thrive and grow. Please make your voice heard and vote on May 20.

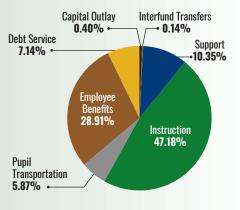

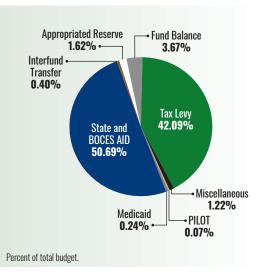

OTHER PROPOSITIONS VOTERS WILL CONSIDER

When Middleburgh residents go to the polls on May 20, they will vote on three propositions in addition to the 2025-26 proposed budget.

One proposition will be for the purchase of two, 65-passenger diesel buses with luggage compartments and one 30-passenger wheelchair-accessible bus, with a total not to exceed \$484,000. New buses replace old buses based on the bus's mileage, age, repair history, and condition and coincide with the district's long-range bus replacement plan to keep the bus fleet in safe, working order. State aid would fund \$368,324 (76.1%) of the total purchase cost.

A second proposition will ask voters to consider a transfer, not to exceed \$600,000, to the Repair Reserve Fund to cover any one-time unanticipated repair expenditures for the upcoming year.



Residents will also vote on an \$8.1 million dollar capital project that would utilize state grants and \$2 million dollars from our Capital Reserve Fund to pay for over a dozen repairs and improvements to our facilities. **If passed, the capital project would have no additional impact on our tax levy.** See newsletter insert for additional information.

*Under NYS law, a school may submit a budget to voters a maximum of two times. If the budget is defeated, the Board of Education may adopt a contingent budget or put a budget before the voters a second time. If the budget is defeated twice, the Board of Education must adopt a contingent budget and cannot increase the current year tax levy amount. As a result, the Board would be required to reduce the proposed budget by \$156,144. In this event, the district would be subject to restrictions and limitations in areas where money can be spent. For example, the purchase of new equipment would not be permitted, and there would be mandated charges for the use of school facilities by outside organizations (Section 2023 Education Law).

VOTER INFORMATION

Voter Eligibility

By law, all voters must be U.S. citizens, at least 18 years old and residents of the Middleburgh Central School District for at least 30 days prior to the vote. Voters must have a valid I.D.

Absentee & Early Ballots

You must complete an application to receive an absentee or early ballot.

Absentee and early ballot applications are available on the district website or by contacting District Clerk Kim Lawyer: **518-827-3625.**

If a voter requests to receive a ballot by mail, the application must be received by the district clerk by **5 p.m. on May 13.** If the voter is going to pick up the ballot in person in the district office, it must be picked up by **5 p.m. on May 19.** All ballots must be received by **5 p.m. on May 20.**

Military ballots were delivered to military voters prior to the deadline of **April 25**.

2025-26 SCHOOL YEAR BUDGET SUMMARY

New York state law requires school districts to present their budgets divided into three expenditure categories—program, administrative and capital—and compare them to the previous year's costs.

Middleburgh's three-part budget breaks down as follows:

2025/2026 BUDGET VOTE PROPOSITIONS

<u>PROPOSITION #1:</u> SHALL the Board of Education of the Middleburgh Central School District, be authorized and empowered to expend the sum of \$25,100,00 for the 2025-2026 school year and to levy the necessary tax thereof?

PROPOSITION #2: SHALL the Board of Education of the Middleburgh Central School District be authorized to: (1) acquire school buses at a cost not to exceed \$484,000, which is estimated to be the maximum cost thereof; (2) expend such sum for such purpose; (3) levy the necessary tax therefore, to be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education in accordance with Section 416 of the Education Law, taking into State aid; and (4) in anticipation of the collection of such tax, issue bonds and notes of the District at one time or from time to time in the principal amount not to exceed \$484,000, and levy a tax to pay the interest on said obligations when due?

PROPOSITION #3: SHALL the Board of Education of the Middleburgh Central School District Board of Education be authorized to fund the Repair Reserve in the amount not to exceed \$600,000 from the unappropriated 2024-25 fund balance to be used for repairs of capital improvements or equipment, which repairs are of a type not recurring annually or at shorter intervals?

PROPOSITION #4: SHALL the Board of Education of the Middleburgh Central School District be authorized to (1) reconstruct, renovate and improve various School District buildings, facilities and sites, acquire original furnishings, equipment, machinery or apparatus required for the purpose for which such buildings, facilities and sites are to be used and pay incidental costs related thereto, at a maximum cost of \$8,100,000, (2) expend such sum for such purpose, including \$2,000,000 from the Capital Reserve Fund, (3) levy the necessary tax therefore, taking into account State aid received and the amount expended from the Capital Reserve Fund, to be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education in accordance with Section 416 of the Education Law, and (4) in anticipation of the collection of such tax, issue bonds and notes at one time or from time to time in the principal amount not to exceed \$6,100,000, and levy a tax to pay the interest on said obligations when due?

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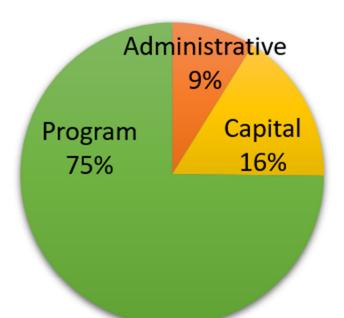

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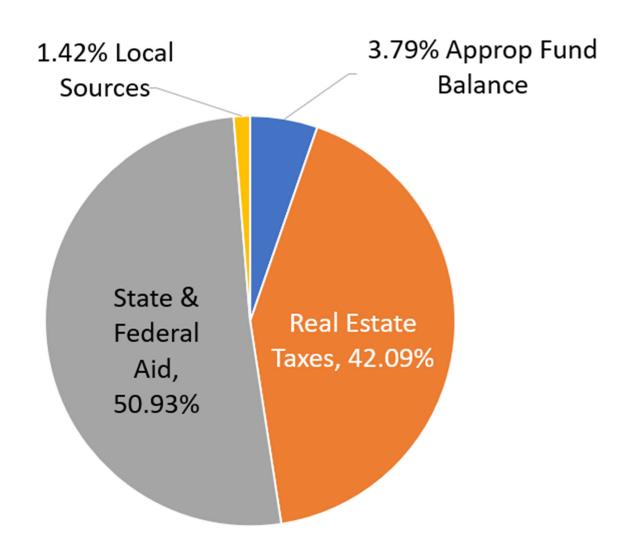

The proposed tax levy increase is BELOW to Maximum allowable tax levy limit.

Middleburgh CSD tax base includes 11 towns in 2 counties.

A tax levy increase means the District will collect 1.50% more in property taxes than last year.

It does NOT mean an individual's school tax rate is increasing by 1.50%.

Factors affecting individual tax rates:

- New properties added to the assessment rolls;
- Properties removed from the assessor rolls (i.e., property change in tax exemption status);
- Changes in assessed values;
- Changes in equalization rates;
- Change in assessed value of equalization rate in one (1) town will affect the proportion of tax levied for that town and all

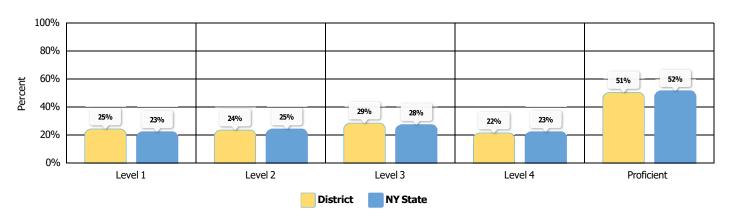
Percent Scoring at Levels for All Students

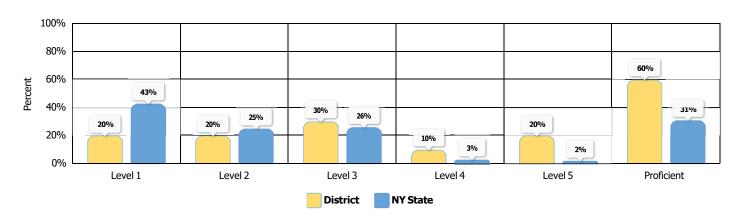

ANNUAL REGENTS EXAMINATION IN ELA (2023-24)



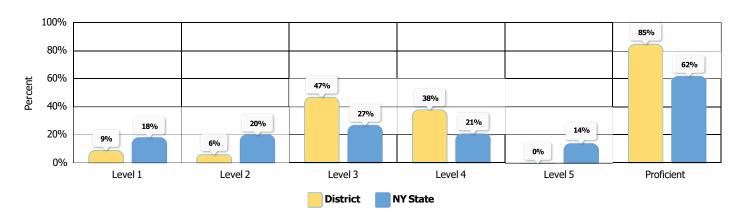

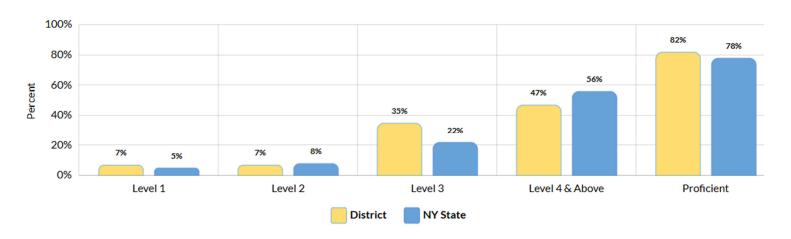
TOTAL COHORT REGENTS EXAMINATION RESULTS

A High School Cohort consists of all students who first enter grade 9 anywhere or, in the case of ungraded students with disabilities, reach their seventeenth birthday in a particular school year (July 1 - June 30). The "year" used to identify the cohort is the year in which the July 1 - December 31 dates fall. Results are reported four years after these students first enter grade 9.

Due to COVID-19 and changes to New York State testing requirements, Regents examinations in June 2020 through January 2022 were canceled, with the exception of the June 2021 Regents Examinations in ELA, Algebra I, Living Environment, and Physical Setting/Earth Science. The U.S. History & Government examination from June 2022 through January 2023 was also canceled.

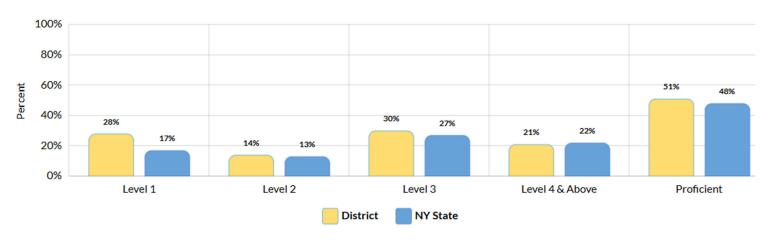
2020 TOTAL COHORT REGENTS IN ELA

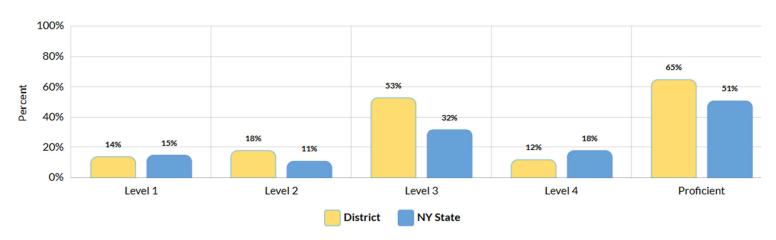

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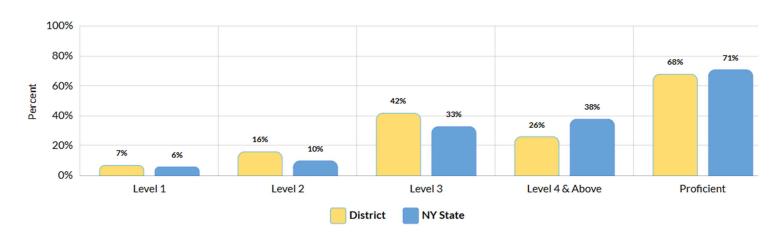

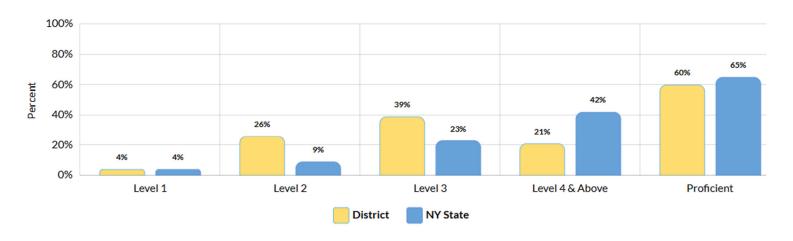
